SUBJECT: STUDENT DEMONSTRATIONS AT MULTIMEDIA UNIVERSITY OF KENYA DUE TO WATER SUPPLY DISRUPTION

The Multimedia University of Kenya (MMU) would like to address the ongoing student demonstrations at the university, which have been sparked by a temporary disruption in water supply. The issue arose from a damaged water main pipe that affected the regular flow of water to the university.

On learning of the situation, the University Management took immediate action and has worked tirelessly to resolve the problem. We are pleased to inform students and all stakeholders that the water supply was restored last night, and normal flow is now continuing across the university.

We acknowledge that despite the restoration, some students are still expressing concerns through demonstrations, which are currently confined to the university premises. The MMU senior Management team comprising of DVC-Academic Affairs, Research & Innovation, DVC- Administration, Finance & Planning and the Registrar Academic Affairs are on campus managing the situation and are actively engaging the student leadership to address their concerns and ensure a swift return to normalcy. The police are also on ground to ensure security.

MMU remains committed to ensuring that all students have access to the basic necessities they require for their studies and comfortable stay on campus. We are continually working to enhance the well-being of our students and to avoid any future disruptions.

We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience caused by this situation to all stakeholders, including our students, staff, parents, guardians partners and the general public. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we work towards providing a conducive learning and working environment for all students and MMU staff.
